COVID-19 Protocol

Volunteer Expectations

Wear a facemask when unable to maintain 6 feet distance from those around you, except while eating or drinking

Upon arrival, verify they are fever free (temperature check) and have no symptoms

Check to ensure room is stocked with appropriate cleaning supplies: Paper Towels, Antibacterial Soap, Disinfectant, Disposable gloves

Cleaning Protocol (Immediately following use of room)

- Wear disposable gloves to clean & disinfect
- Clean countertops with soap and water, then clean with disinfectant (Currently we use Clorox Clean anywhere)
- Wipe down door knobs, toys, light switches, tables, high chairs, sink faucets/handles, toilet seats (with disinfectant).
- Wash Hands (See above protocol)



COVID-19 Protocol, cont

Cleaning Toys:

- Toys that cannot be cleaned and sanitized should not be used.
- All toys should be cleaned with soap and water and then clean with an EPA registered disinfectant.
- Do not share toys with other classes unless they are washed and sanitized before being transferred to another class.
- Set aside toys that need to be cleaned. Place in a bin marked “Dirty Toys”

When a child arrives at the church:

- Volunteers will use a digital forehead thermometer to check temperature as children walk into the church foyer. Children are not permitted if they have a fever surpassing 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit.
- We encourage children between the ages of 2 and 11 to wear a face mask when inside the building (though not required). Children 12 years of age and older are required to wear facemasks when social distancing can not occur per the Clemson City Mask Mandate.



COVID-19 Protocol, cont

What if someone gets sick?

If a child develops a fever while present on campus they will be placed in a designated area (church bookstore) along with at least one volunteer to separate from other children and volunteers. Their parents will be notified immediately to pick them up.

If COVID-19 is confirmed in a child, volunteer, or staff member

- Close off areas used by the person who is sick.
- Clean and disinfect all areas used by the person who is sick, such as offices, bathrooms, and common areas.
- Call family immediately for pick-up
- Anyone in close contact with someone who has been confirmed positive will be notified by Crosspoint Church.
- Anyone who has tested positive should not return for the remainder of VBS week.



COVID-19 Protocol, cont

When can a child re-enter kids spaces after being infected by COVID-19 or after being exposed to someone who is?

Once a child or family has successfully completed the quarantine guidance provided by the CDC and are symptom free, they are welcome to re-enter public spaces and join our worship gathering.

Snack:

We plan to offer pre-packaged snacks to children while at VBS. Our volunteers will pass out snacks wearing gloves and a facemask to help prevent the transfer of germs. We will not offer snack items containing nuts. Please notify us if there are any additional allergy concerns we should be aware of for your child.



COVID-19 Protocol, cont

How will contact exposure be limited and/or tracked?

- Students will stay with their specific age group / class for the entire week.
- During the Morning and Afternoon Rally, students will sit in “pods” with their specific group. There will be taped off areas in the sanctuary for each class. This will provide a fun way to sit together, move, sing, and wiggle - without mixing age groups.
- As much as allowed, we will limit room to room movement - instead of the typical rotation to other rooms, Craft, Music, & Missions Teachers will come into your child’s classroom setting.
- Snack and Recreation will be held outside (weather permitting).
- We are keeping children and volunteers in their “pods” so that if we need to contact anyone about exposure, we can pinpoint the specific classroom involved.



COVID-19 Protocol, cont

Diapering

When diapering a child, wash your hands and wash the child's hands before you begin and wear gloves. Follow safe diaper changing procedures. Procedures should be posted in all diaper changing areas. Steps include:

- Prepare (includes washing hands, putting on gloves)
- Clean the child (wash their hands with soap and water)
- Remove trash (soiled diaper and wipes)
- Replace diaper
- Wash child's hands again
- Clean up diapering station
- Wash hands

After diapering, wash your hands (even if you were wearing gloves) and disinfect the diapering area with a fragrance-free bleach that is EPA-registered as a sanitizing or disinfecting solution. If other products are used for sanitizing or disinfecting, they should also be fragrance-free and EPA-registered. If the surface is dirty, it should be cleaned with detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.

If reusable cloth diapers are used, they should not be rinsed or cleaned in the facility. The soiled cloth diaper and its contents (without emptying or rinsing) should be placed in a plastic bag or into a plastic-lined, hands-free covered diaper pail to give to parents/guardians or laundry service.
